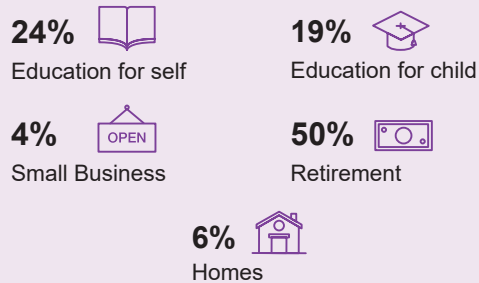


WANDA's Impact

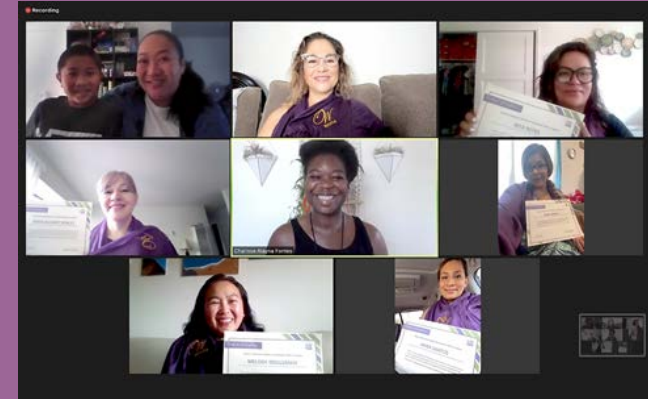

Creating a Future Vision - Together

WANDA is dedicated to advancing the socioeconomic mobility of low-income single mother families through Education, Equity and Empowerment. The past two years tested the resolve of mothers across the United States. COVID-19 has perpetuated gender inequity and had compounding impact on the mental and physical health of single mothers. It is known that mothers are burdened with the heavier load of unpaid domestic household responsibilities, are typically the lesser wage earners and often work in jobs disproportionately impacted by pandemic closures and demand.

Between March and April of last year, 3.5 million mothers living with school age children left active work. As of January 2021, 1.6 million fewer mothers were working than the year prior (US Census 2021). Single mothers represented a quarter of homeowners in 2019, double since 1990 (Urban Institute 2021). Yet, the effect of the pandemic on the workforce, cost of childcare, and 20% rise in home rates over the past 5 months, pushed many single mothers out of the market, upending years of progress.

Our single mother community has struggled, but they are resilient and continue to persevere.

WANDA clients invest in their first homes, apply for higher jobs and/or ask for promotions, start their own businesses, continue to build their savings and, most importantly, maintain their commitment to and resolve for a better life for themselves and their families. **It is imperative that we continue to build economic justice for single mother families and the future generations they are raising.** You, our supporters, are why we can do what we do and we know you are as inspired by WANDA moms as they are by each other. 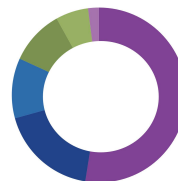

Income and Expense Breakout

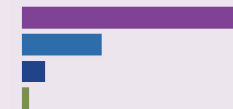
REVENUE COMPOSITION
